Keep an eye on tread depth

Make sure tires stay in good condition and show no signs of arising issues.

Tire pressure

Regularly checking tire pressure is vital during the change in season. For every 10 degrees Celsius decrease in temperature, tires lose 2 to 4 pounds of pressure. An underinflation by 20% results in a 30% reduction of tire life.

Replace wipers

Replacing wipers blades annually before the cold weather starts, will ensure best visibility throughout unpredictable weather.



Check your alignment

A poor alignment will result in steering and tire problems. During winter you will want to ensure your trucks are ready to handle the tougher conditions. A drive axle out by a mere 1/16" will push the steer tires sideways for 13.5 feet of every kilometre driven.

Does your fleet drive through BC?



Don't forget, winter rated tires or chains are required on most routes in British Columbia from October 1 to April 30.

Commercial trucks weighing between 5,000 kg and 11,794 kg LGVW must carry chains or acceptable traction devices or have winter rated tires.

Commercial vehicles 11,794 kg LGVW and greater, such as tractor trailers, are required to carry steel chains on most major highways.
